An Act to Require Schools to Provide Instruction Regarding Prevention of the Illegal Use of Fentanyl and Other Drugs and Drug Poisoning Awareness in Grades 6 to 12 and to Establish Drug Poisoning Awareness Week

3	§150-V. Drug Poisoning Awareness Week
4 5 6 7 8 9	The 3rd full week of October of each year is designated as Drug Poisoning Awareness Week to promote the public's awareness of the public health threat posed by the illegal use of fentanyl and its effect on the lives of citizens and their families throughout the State, as well as the effects of the illegal use of other drugs, and the Governor shall annually issue a proclamation inviting and urging the people of the State to observe this week in schools and other suitable places with appropriate activity.
10	Sec. 2. 20-A MRSA §4710-D is enacted to read:
11 12	§4710-D. Prevention of illegal use of fentanyl and other drugs and drug poisoning awareness
13 14 15 16	1. Research-based instruction. A public or private elementary or secondary school shall annually provide not fewer than 10 hours of research-based instruction related to prevention of the illegal use of fentanyl and other drugs with a high risk of overdose and drug poisoning awareness to students in grades 6 to 12.
17	2. Requirements. The instruction required by subsection 1 must include:
18	A. Recognition of signs and symptoms of mental illness;
19	B. Suicide prevention;
20 21	C. Prevention of the illegal use of and addiction to fentanyl and other drugs with a high risk of overdose;
22 23	D. Awareness of local school and community resources and any processes involved in accessing those resources;
24 25	E. Health education that includes information about substance use and substance use disorder, including youth substance use and substance use disorder; and
26	F. Information on how to reverse an overdose.
27 28	3. Provider. The instruction required by subsection 1 may be provided by an entity or an employee or agent of an entity that is:
29	A. A public or private institution of higher education;
30	B. A community-based organization;
31	C. A religious organization; or
32 33	D. A local public health agency specializing in health, mental health or substance use disorder.

35 36 37 38	This bill requires not fewer than 10 hours of instruction in a school year for grades 6 to 12 regarding prevention of the illegal use of fentanyl and other drugs with a high risk of overdose and drug poisoning awareness. It also establishes the 3rd full week of October annually as Drug Poisoning Awareness Week.
